The mission of the Family Crisis Center is to be the expert resource and service provider in eliminating domestic and sexual violence in Bastrop, Colorado, Fayette and Lee Counties.

The Family Crisis Center envisions a safe community built on equality without the existence of violence.

Service Highlights

The Family Crisis Center's fiscal year 2009 data includes services and financial history from October 1, 2008 through September 30, 2009.

The **Prevention Education Team** provides quality, community education regarding domestic violence and sexual violence in Bastrop, Colorado, Fayette, and Lee Counties. In fiscal year 2009, **511** prevention (anti-violence/anti-victimization) programs were presented to **5,767** elementary and **7,674** middle and high school students.

The **Crisis Team** prioritizes the safety of victims of domestic violence and sexual assault through advocacy, support services, information and options throughout the process of change. In fiscal year 2009, **1,202** individuals received crisis services and **4,975** hotline calls were answered.

The **Residential Services Team** offers a temporary refuge, affordable housing and support services for individuals and families who have experienced domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse. Both shelter and transitional housing services are addressed through advocacy, life skills and counseling. In fiscal year 2009, **6,309** nights of emergency shelter were provided for **146** adults and **172** children, and **26**

adults and **37** children received transitional housing services.

The **Counseling Team** facilitates change and empowers individuals who have been impacted by abuse. In fiscal year 2009, **251** youth and **95** adults received counseling services.

The **Violence Intervention Programs** provide an environment for group and individual counseling that helps to empower positive life style changes while holding offenders accountable. In fiscal year 2009, **206** adults participated in Adult Violence Intervention Programs (AVIP) & **72** adults participated in Protective Parenting Programs.

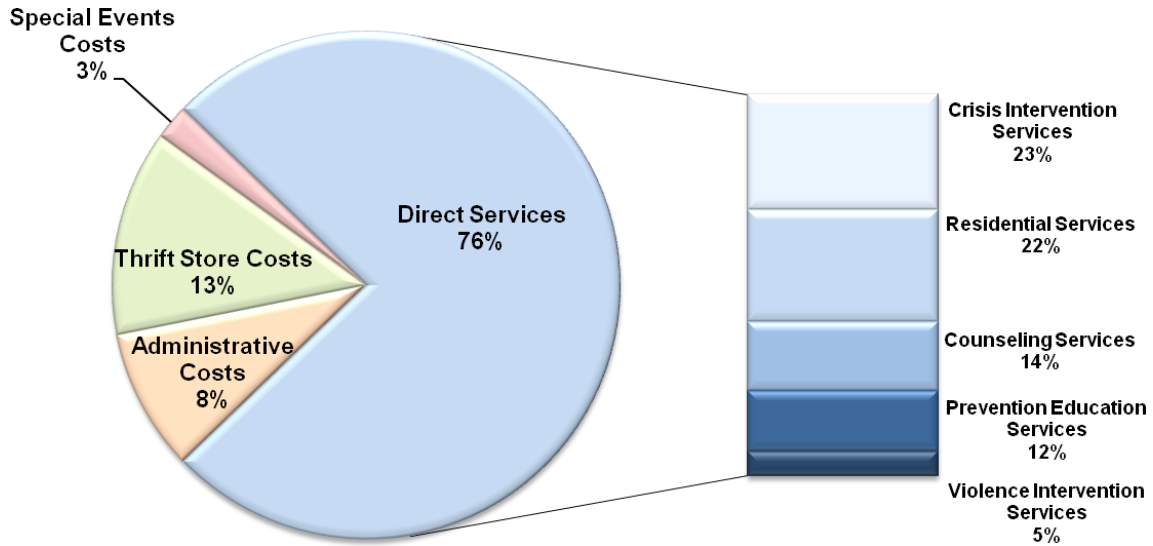
All of the Center's programs and services are supported by the Board of Directors and agency volunteers who provided **12,834** hours of service in fiscal year 2009.
